# Timely Tips

# Grazing

- Clip pastures for weeds and seedheads as needed.
- Use portable fencing to increase paddock numbers to allow for longer recovery periods.
- When present, crabgrass and johnsongrass can provide highquality summer grazing.
- Begin grazing native and annual warm-season grasses. Start at 18-20" and stop at 8-10".

## **Small Ruminants**

- June is a good time to evaluate the dewormer you are using for any resistance among your animals. You can do this by having a fecal egg count done before and after worming.
- High-risk months for parasites are July and August so be prepared!

## Cattle

- Prevent/control Pinkeye
- Maintain a clean water supply and check it routinely.
- Maintain salt-mineral feeders. Provide a free-choice mineral mix at all times.
- Monitor ponds, streams, and riparian areas throughout the grazing season to assess cattle impact.
- Ensure access to shade for very hot and humid days.

# Deadline For submissions is September 30th, 2024

The South-Central KY Area Hay Contest is offered to all individuals raising hay in Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, Green, Marion, McCreary, Pulaski, Rockcastle, Russell, Taylor, Washington, and Wayne counties.

This program aims to provide producers with free hay analysis results to aid in raising higherquality forages and meeting livestock needs. Producers may submit samples in each contest area to their county agriculture agent. This is a free service, regardless of the number of samples submitted.

Basic analysis results will be sent to producers by November 1st, 2024. Results will include crude protein, DM, TDN, RFV, ADF, and NDF. Producers may be provided with livestock ration recommendations in addition to their results upon request. After completion of the program, an areawide event will be held to provide an educational overview of the program and present awards to contest winners. There will be one winner selected for the entire area for each hay class. # **BANANA "ICE CREAM"**

#### **Ingredients**

- 2 bananas, sliced and frozen
- 2 tablespoons milk
- Toppings (optional)

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Peel and slice bananas, place in a freezer bag and freeze overnight.
- 2. Blend banana pieces and milk in a blender until smooth and creamy. (Turn blender off and shake or stir periodically if pieces aren't blending). It might take a few minutes for it to become the consistency of soft-serve ice cream.
- 3. Enjoy!

**Notes**: You can mix in a handful of sliced strawberries, a tablespoon of peanut butter, or a teaspoon of coconut flakes for a different flavor.
