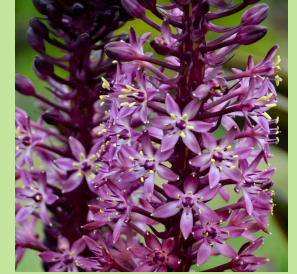
Prizewinning Pineapple Lilies



Pineapple lilies aren't actually lilies or pineapples but they get their name from their appearance.

These tropical looking plants are

Although these plants have the common name as crinum lilies, they aren't true lilies at all either. Crinums are actually in the family Hippeastrum which is the amaryllis family. The crinums in
